EQUINE CANADA BRONZE COMPETITION SERIES 2022 ENTRY FORM

The Victoria-Saanich CADORA Society competition series is sanctioned as a Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada, 201-11 Hines Road, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 2X1 and is governed by the rules of EC. (A602.1). Please ensure that you read the following rules and regulations carefully.

EQUINE CANADA COMPETITION RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5)
- 2. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the persons responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC participation in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions, to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.7)
- 3. Victoria Saanich CADORA Society Bronze-Competition Series 2019 is sanctioned as a Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada, 201-11 Hines Road, Ottawa, Ontario K2K 2X1 and is governed by the rules of EC. (A602.1)
- 4. Statement of Principle: Equestrian Canada (EC), the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses/ponies in all competitions under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to upholding the welfare of the horses/ponies, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities. Requiring that horses/ponies be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment. Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses/ponies as well as horses/ponies placed in their care for any purpose; providing for the continuous well-being of horses/ponies by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure; continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition; reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses/ponies. The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.
- 5. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.(A602.2)
- 6. Identification numbers must be worn and visible at all times while on the competition grounds.
- 7. An Equine Canada Bronze Sport License must be obtained prior to entering any Bronze competition. Horse passport is not required.
- 8. All athletes regardless of age or level of competition must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at the event location. (E 4.0)
- 9. BioSecurity: Victoria Saanich CADORA Society is committed to providing a healthy environment for all horses and competitors. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. No horse entering the showgrounds may have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 15 days. Avoid any direct or indirect contact between horses or use of common feed/drinking buckets.
- 10. All competitors entering an EC Competition must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. See rules of EC Section A General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
- 11. All horses attending Equestrian Canada Sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

Definition: Person(s) Responsible (see Waiver on Entry Form)

The Person (s) Responsible for a horse is an adult who has, or shares, responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse/pony and who has official responsibility for that horse/pony under EC Rules and is liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violation of the EC Rules. The Person(s) Responsible must hold an EC individual or group license (see A203. 4). For the purpose of these Rules, the Person(s) Responsible is normally the trainer, owner or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during an event, or a parent or legal guardian in the case of junior competitors. The Person(s) Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse/pony and is alone responsible for any act performed in the stables by himself or herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. Parents and guardians are entitled to sign their children's entry forms without being EC members or holder of a sport license, provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book (A.214.2). However, if the parent is also the person responsible, they must hold an EC individual or group license (A203.4)

VICTORIA SAANICH CADORA SOCIETY COMPETITION RULES & INFORMATION

- 1. CADORA is running both HCBC and Bronze shows on the same day. All Bronze Tests will be run after the HCBC tests.
- 2. Entry priority will be given to CADORA members up to the entry closing date. Late entries will be accommodated when possible and non-CADORA entrants will be given equal priority after closing date. The competition organizing committee has the right to refuse any entry.
- Competitors must include payment, entry form, volunteer sign up form and proof (photocopy) of current HCBC membership
 and EC Sport license for entries to be accepted. Note: proof of HCBC & EC is required only with your first show entry of
 the year.
- 4. Entry fee refunds: For scratches prior to the entry close date full refund of entry fees. For scratches after the entry close date entry fee refund only on presentation of a veterinarian's or physician's certificate. No substitution of horse or athlete may be made after entry closing deadline
- 5. Competitors may enter up to two tests, entries permitting.
- 6. Tests Offered:
 - a. Equestrian Canada Tests of Choice Intro through Fourth Level
 - b. Equestrian Canada MASTERS TOC-open to riders 60 and over; please write 'Masters' after your chosen test on the form
 - c. FEI Test of Choice
 - d. Equestrian Canada Para Dressage Tests / FEI Para Equestrian Tests
- 7. Entries OPEN one month prior to the show date and CLOSE on the Monday 2 weeks prior to the show. Entries received after the closing date will be accepted in the show if there is space. HOWEVER entries received later than the Monday one week before the show will NOT be accepted. **NO EARLY ENTRIES ACCEPTED.**
- 8. Entries MUST be emailed. NO drop off entries accepted.
- 9. In the interest of keeping entry fees to a minimum, the competition committee requires all riders to be available to volunteer assistance with the running of the competition.
- 10. Anyone may ride in the Open category. No cross entry between Junior and Amateur categories.
- 11. Riders may enter to ride the same test more than once, however only the first score will count. The second score will be hors concours.
- 12. Ribbons are awarded to 6th place. Classes with only one entry will have ribbons awarded based on percentage score. No ribbons awarded for scores under 51%. (E 9.9.10)
- 13. Ride times posted are approximate. Allow time for your ride to be a maximum of 15 minutes early in case of scratches.
- 14. Year-end awards are based on the three highest scores achieved at the same level for the same horse/rider combination scored by three different judges. Only Victoria Saanich CADORA Society members are eligible for club awards and riders must have volunteered for CADORA functions/competitions during the year to qualify for awards.
- 15. VS CADORA does not provide a place for lunging. NO unauthorized lunging is allowed.
- 16. The warmup ring for the shows is the indoor arena. Up to two riders will be allowed in the outdoor ring to continue their warmup before their test. Under no circumstances may a rider be inside the competition ring unless they are performing their test in front of the Judge. EXCEPTION When the rider has paid for and been given a scheduled schooling ride it will not be judged.
- 17. Rules specific to the warm-up area:
 - a. no hand walking allowed
 - b. please ride left hand to left hand
 - c. horses being ridden at the walk are required to leave the rail free for horses trotting or cantering
 - d. coaches must stand outside the ring while coaching
 - e. the Whipper-In is in charge of conduct in the warm-up area and has the authority to excuse a horse/rider combination from the area if they are perceived as a possible safety threat to themselves or other riders

Victoria Saanich CADORA Society Show Volunteer Policy (adopted January 2010): If the volunteer, or their designated stand in, does not show up for their assigned volunteer job they will have to make it up by putting in volunteer hours at another VS Cadora Society show before they can enter to ride in a future VS Cadora Society show.

SET-UP SCRIBE WHIPPER-IN RUNNER/SCORER TEAR DOWN SURROUNDS TRAILER **VOLUNTEER JOB DESCRIPTIONS SET-UP:** Set up volunteers set up all aspects of the dressage ring normally the evening before the show. SCRIBE: As the rider is performing their test the Scribe writes the judge's comments and numerical scores given for each movement on to the test sheet. The Scribe must be able to focus, keep up with the movements of the test, and write legibly and quickly for extended periods of time. WHIPPER-IN: The Whipper In is responsible for making sure the correct rider enters the arena at specified ride times. The Whipper In also watches the warm-up area to make sure riders are following the warm up area rules and know the order of go. SCORER: The Scorer collects the test sheets from the Scribe, and returns to the show office to add up the scores directly from the tests using an adding machine. TEAR-DOWN: Tear Down volunteers dismantle and store all aspects of the dressage ring after the final ride on the day of the show. SURROUNDS TRAILER: Responsible for providing a towing vehicle for the show trailer or judging booth for set-up and/or tear- down. This entails towing the show trailer or judging booth into the ring while set-up and/or tear down is in progress. For shows away from the Saanich Fairgrounds you will be responsible for towing the show trailer to the alternate site. Please check, if relevant to your particular circumstances. OPTIONS FOR VOLUNTEERING AT VS CADORA (SOCIETY) BRONZE SHOWS

- 1. Show up and do the scheduled volunteer shift yourself.
- Persuade a reliable friend or family member to cover your assigned shift. The rider <u>MUST</u> notify the Competition Manager of the name and contact information of the designated volunteer. The rider remains responsible for ensuring the volunteer shift is covered.
- 3. Build up some 'volunteer goodwill' by volunteering to help at a show you are not riding in. All volunteer time at the shows will be recorded and taken into account by the Show Chair when setting the volunteer schedule. When possible, riders who have not yet volunteered will be scheduled ahead of those who have already helped at a show.
