The Capital City Classic Dressage Competition 2022 is sanctioned as a Gold Class C and Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada, 11 Hines Road, Suite 201, Ottawa, Ontario K2K 2X1 and is governed by the rules of EC. (A602.1) Statement of Principle: Equine Canada (EC), the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses/ponies in all competitions under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to upholding the welfare of the horses/ponies, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities. Requiring that horses/ponies be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment. Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses/ponies as well as horses/ponies placed in their care for any purpose; providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure; providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives; continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition; reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses/ponies. The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

# RULES AND REGULATIONS - BRONZE

## GENERAL RULES

1. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book and in particular Section E Dressage 2022(A602.2) Knowledge of the rules is the responsibility of the competitor. Please direct questions regarding rules and regulations to the Steward. All competitors are advised to check the Equestrian Canada Website: [www.equestrian.ca](http://www.equestrian.ca)
2. ARTICLE E 4.0 SAFETY HEADGEAR (effective Jan 1, 2014). All athletes, regardless of age or level or competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. *Note: At the tack check which follows the test, the steward may ask the athlete to dismount so that the helmet may be inspected.*
  - a) All athletes of any age must wear protective headgear at all times while mounted at the event location.
  - b) The penalty for contravening E 4.0. is elimination.
  - c) Non-competing athletes who contravene E 4.0. will be instructed to dismount until wearing a properly fitted and fastened helmet.
3. Any horse/pony entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5)
4. All horses attending Equestrian Canada Sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.
5. All tests will be held in a 20 x 60 ring. Only exception to be if a Para Dressage test is requested requiring a change of ring to 20 x 40.
6. Gate at A will remain open at all times for all competitors. (E.7.14.3)
7. Callers are allowed in all National tests. Competitors must provide their own callers who must be appropriately dressed. (E.9.1.4.)
8. The horse's competition number must be worn and visible at all times while on Saanich Fairgrounds property, failure to do so may result in elimination. (E.7.11.2)
9. Hors concours entries are not permitted.
10. No horse/pony may compete in more than four tests/classes per day up to and including First level and no more than three tests/classes Second, Third, Fourth and all FEI tests/classes, including Freestyles and Young Horse classes. (E.7.11.9.1)
11. Neither Saanich Fairgrounds nor any member of the show committee will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators, owners, trainers, athletes or grooms.
12. Dogs must be leashed and under control at all times. Loose dogs will be impounded and the owners fined \$50.00. Any unruly dogs will be asked to leave the show grounds.
13. Entry to Show Grounds is through Gate #6 only.
14. Any person staying overnight on the grounds is subject to an overnight fee, regardless if you are staying in an RV, tent, horse trailer, car etc. Camping cost is \$40 per night, \$55 with power hookup.
15. Schooling of horses/ponies may only be done by EC Sport License holders. (E 7.11.12.1)
16. Lunging unmounted or work in hand may only be done by the athlete, owner, coach, groom or Person Responsible. (E 7.11.12.4 / E.7.16.3) Lunging is permitted in specified areas only. Lunging is not permitted in the grass field at any time. Mounted lunging is not permitted. (E.7.11.12.5). Lunging is only permitted in the indoor ring and only two horses can be lunged at the same time.
17. All classes will be scored according to current rules of EC using current penalization rules for errors. (E.9.3.2)
18. Ride times will be posted at 3:00 pm on Friday July 8, 2022, at the Saanich Fairgrounds. Ride times will be posted on the web site: [vsadora.com](http://vsadora.com), and our Facebook page Victoria Saanich Cadora on Wednesday July 6, 2022.
19. **DO NOT** arrive at the Show Grounds before 12 noon Friday, July 8, 2022. Anyone arriving before this time must report to the Saanich Fairgrounds Office and pay any stabling or ring use fees directly to them.
20. No cross-entry between Gold and Bronze Shows allowed.
21. This being a concurrent Gold/Bronze competition, no leg boots, bandages, bell boots or leg wraps will be permitted in the competition arena.
22. Bio-Security: The Capital City Classic is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all athletes and their horses at this competition. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices; please avoid any direct or indirect contact between horses or use of any common feed or drinking buckets. No horse entering the competition grounds can have been in contact with any sick horse (s) within the last 15 days

## ENTRIES

1. Entries open **Friday, May 27, 2022**
2. Entries must be received by e-mail no later than **Monday, June 27, 2022 at 5:00 pm**
3. Entries received after closing date are subject to a late fee of \$40.00 and will be limited to the ride times available.
4. **Please use one entry form for each horse and athlete combination with separate e-transfers for each individual entry.**
5. Only completed, legible entries that include all photocopies and a signed, dated waiver will be accepted. Entries not including copies of required membership cards will be subject to a \$25.00 incomplete entry fee. All entries must include a photocopy of a current EC Bronze Sport License for the athlete, otherwise the temporary license fee will apply. As well, you must include a photocopy of a current HCBC membership for both athlete and horse owner.
6. Effective 2022, ARTICLE A 102 SAFE SPORT ENVIRONMENTS requires safe sport training for sport licence holders and requires Coach status for individuals coaching at EC sanctioned events.
7. All competitors entering an EC Competition must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. See rules of EC Section A General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
8. **Competitors wishing to ride in the Amateur category must include a photocopy of a current EC Sport License** showing Amateur status as designated by EC (Amateur box must be ticked and Date of Birth printed on card). Entries not showing proof of Amateur status will be entered in Open classes - **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
9. Entries must be e-mailed to [capitalcityclassic22@gmail.com](mailto:capitalcityclassic22@gmail.com) password must be 'dressage'. No drop off or mailed entries will be accepted.
10. E-mailed entries must include a copy of the entry form; e-transfer of funds due; copies of EC and HCBC membership. Any corrections on entries and monies owing must be cleared up before entries close or entry will be void.
11. E-transfers will be completed prior to the start of the show. Numbers will not be given to competitors who have outstanding show entry fees. The Show Committee will attempt to contact any competitor who has an outstanding balance prior to the start of the show.
12. The Show Committee reserves the right to limit, to two, the number of horses ridden by an athlete (A.805.5), also to limit the number of entries, the number of tests ridden by an athlete, Bronze and Gold combined, (Young Horse classes not to count), and/or refuse any entry, split, cancel or combine and/or adjust classes or awards, govern all conditions of the show, and make decisions upon any matter not covered by current EC rules.
13. Entries received prior to the received date, but after the competition is full, will be put on a waiting list. They will not be subject to late fees if they are accepted into the show. If the competitor does not wish to be on a wait list or does not get into the show, all entry fees will be refunded.
14. Before the entry deadline, changes to entries are accepted at the discretion of the entry secretary and subject to a \$25 office fee.
15. **After the entry deadline NO changes to classes will be made.**
16. After the entry deadline, horse/pony and athlete substitutions may only be made in the event of illness or injury with a veterinarian or physician certificate, providing that the class, test and category remain the same. These changes are subject to a \$25 office fee. Once a horse/pony or athlete has withdrawn from the show, for any reason, these substitutions can no longer be made. Substitutions must be made at time of withdrawal. A veterinarian or physician certificate must be presented before 3pm Sunday, July 10, 2022. Horse and athlete cannot be substituted in the same entry.

## CLASS RULES

1. Classes may be scheduled at any time on the day listed on the class schedule.
2. **Ride times will be posted on the website ([www.vscadora.com](http://www.vscadora.com)) and VSCadora Facebook page by Wednesday evening July 6<sup>th</sup>. Times may be rescheduled at any time due to scratches, errors, overlapping times, unforeseen conflicts or to facilitate the running of the show.**
3. **Competitors must check the website or Facebook for updated ride schedules on the morning of each show day. In the case of a discrepancy between the posted day sheets and any other published ride schedule, the day sheet will be considered correct. No changes may be made to ride times once posted.**
4. In the event that there are less than four entries in any athlete category (Jr, Am, Open), the Show Committee reserves the right to combine athlete categories within classes, where permitted.
5. Ties will be broken by the collective marks. Ties remaining after collective marks will stay tied. (E 9.9.4).

6. Western Dressage tests are offered as a Miscellaneous Class using USEF/WDAA tests. United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF). Reprinted with the permission of USEF. All rights reserved. Reproduction without permissions is prohibited by law. USEF is not responsible for any errors or omissions in the publication of the use of its copyrighted materials in any unauthorized manner.

## **FREESTYLES**

1. Freestyle music must be in MP3 format and athletes must be emailed to [capitalcityclassic22@gmail.com](mailto:capitalcityclassic22@gmail.com) before 5 pm Thursday July 7, 2022
2. All freestyles will be classified as Open. Entries may ride a maximum of two consecutive freestyles but may not cross-enter to the Gold Level freestyle or exceed the maximum amount of tests allowable per day as specified by the show committee or EC.(E.7.11.9.1)
3. The EC freestyle level must correspond to the technical level (or the one above) at which the horse/pony/athlete combination is competing in at this show. e.g.: when riding a Second Level technical test you would be eligible to ride a First or Second Level freestyle. (E 10.6.3)
4. Bronze competitions require no minimum technical score. An athlete in a Bronze competition may enter a freestyle without having ridden a technical test in the level of the freestyle entered. (E 10.6.1 Note)

## **REFUNDS**

1. Prior to the show closing date, all fees will be refunded, less the administration fee.
2. After the closing date, class and stabling fees will be refunded with a veterinarian's or physician's certificate, administration fees will not be refunded. A certificate must be presented to the entry secretary no later than July 13, 2022 for any fees to be refunded.

## **STABLING**

1. Stalls are available for rent at the show grounds. The cost is \$90 for the weekend and will be available from noon on Friday, July 8, 2022, until 7pm on Sunday July, 10, 2022. Overnight stabling is \$50 from 7am one day to 7pm the following day. Day stalls are \$35 and are available from 7am to 7pm the same day, with no overnight.
2. A clean stall CHEQUE deposit of \$50.00 is required to be submitted with your request for stabling. Once the stall is left stripped and checked by the Stable Manager, the cheque will be destroyed.
3. Any damage to the stall will be the responsibility of the competitor and/or the owner of the horse.
4. If entries are not paid in full, the stall will remain closed until cash is paid for the outstanding balance.

## **CAMPING**

1. Camping is permitted on the grounds in designated spots at a cost of \$40/night, \$55 with power hookup.
2. No water or sewer hookup. Please prearrange with entry secretary for power hookup.
3. No dumping of waste tanks anywhere on the fairgrounds. Washrooms at the end of RCMP barn will be available for use. No access to washrooms at main fairgrounds buildings.

**Trailers must park in the designated Trailer Parking Area Only.**

# **RISING STARS EQUITATION DIVISION**

No additional fee charged for entry

## **Description:**

Rising Stars Equitation Division has been created to emphasize the importance of equitation and its influence and effect on the performance of the horse.

This Division will determine the Rising Stars Equitation Division Champion and Reserve Champion. Rising Star Division will only be offered in Bronze Classes 102 and 112 denoted with (\*).

To offer the Rising Stars Equitation Division the show will include the following levels and age categories in this Division:

Bronze: Training and First level Test 2 - Ages:            10-12            13-15            16-21

## **How it works:**

The Championships will be determined once all the eligible tests are completed.

The equitation judging will be done during a regularly scheduled technical test. The technical judge will be seated at C as usual. The equitation judge will sit at H or M and judge only the rider's equitation during the technical test. A Rising Stars Equitation score sheet has been created specifically for the Equitation judging.

The scores from the Equitation score sheet (NOT combined with the technical test score sheet) will be tabulated and the top 2 scores in each age category, at each level will qualify for the head to head 'Ride Off'.

The 'Ride Off' will bring together all top 2 riders from each age category and each level in a dressage seat hack class. A 'Ride Off' will be run for this Show.

The winner and second place for this head to head 'Ride Off' will be the Rising Stars Equitation Champion and Reserve Champion for this show.

# BRONZE LEVEL AWARDS

AWARDS WILL BE GIVEN OUT ONCE CONFIRMED.

Rosettes awarded to 6th place. Rosettes can be picked up with the tests after the class is completed.

When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages: No ribbons shall be awarded below 4th position.

1st	60% or higher
2 <sup>nd</sup>	57% to 59.9%
3 <sup>rd</sup>	54% to 56.9%
4 <sup>th</sup>	51% to 53.9%

Single scores of less than 50% will not count toward any awards, ribbons. (E 9.9.7)

In the event of a tie, the horse/pony/athlete with the highest total collective marks shall be declared the winner. (E 9.9.4)

If the tie is unbreakable, the horse/pony/athlete shall remain tied. (E. 9.9.6)

**Bronze Champion and Reserve Champions will be established by totalling the two highest percentages (which must include one ride at the highest test level of each division) of a horse/pony/athlete combination in each division and athlete category.** The competitor with the highest total will be named champion. The competitor with the second highest total will be named reserve champion. (E.9.10.4)

**BRONZE DIVISION CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION awards will be based on the following Schedule:**

There are three Rising Stars age categories: 10-12yrs, 13-15yrs and 16-21yrs. Rising Star riders in these classes will ride their scheduled technical test 2 in the usual way but with a second judge added using a separate Rising Stars Equitation score sheet. Using the equitation scores only - the **top two riders** of each age category will compete head to head for the overall Champion and Reserve Equitation Championships in a group equitation class.
